WORLD COMMUNICATIONS DAY 2018 "THE TRUTH WILL SET YOU FREE" (JN 8:32) FAKE NEWS AND JOURNALISM FOR PEACE

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

 OMMUNICATION IS PART OF GOD'S PLAN FOR US and an essential way to \checkmark experience fellowship. Made in the image and likeness of our Creator, we are able to express and share all that is true, good, and beautiful. We are able to describe our own experiences and the world around us, and thus to create historical memory and the understanding of events. But when we yield to our own pride and selfishness, we can also distort the way we use our ability to communicate. This can be seen from the earliest times, in the biblical stories of Cain and Abel and the Tower of Babel (cf. Gen 4:4-16; 11:1-9). The capacity to twist the truth is symptomatic of our condition, both as individuals and communities. On the other hand, when we are faithful to God's plan, communication becomes an effective expression of our responsible search for truth and our pursuit of goodness.


In today's fast-changing world of communications and digital systems, we are witnessing the spread of what has come to be known as "fake news." This calls for reflection, which is why I have decided to return in this World Communications Day Message to the issue of truth, which was raised time and time again by my predecessors, beginning with Pope Paul VI, whose 1972 message took as its theme: "Social Communications at the Service of Truth." In this way, I would like to contribute to our shared commitment to stemming the spread of fake news and to rediscovering the dignity of journalism and the personal responsibility of journalists to communicate the truth.

EAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

Welcome to the Diocese of Brooklyn's 27th annual World Communications Day Catholic Media Conference. As communicators, our primary obligation is to seek what is true. This experience should be liberating, but sometimes the search for the truth can be difficult. Pope Francis challenges us to inspire a responsible approach to telling the stories of our brothers and sisters. Not merely surrendering to the evil of sensationalism or exploiting gossip for entertainment, but recognizing the purity of truth and declaring it to the world.

In his message for this year's World Communications Day, the Holy Father writes, "We are able to describe our own experiences and the world around us, and thus to create historical memory and the understanding of events. But when we yield to our own pride and selfishness, we can also distort the way we use our ability to communicate."

We, in the Diocese of Brooklyn, are blessed that for more than a century, we have had a model of fierce veracity right at our fingertips. For 110 years, *The Tablet*'s ink has documented the news and events of our diocese. Decades after they were printed, these pages now serve as a detailed week-by-week historical record of our diocese.

Ed Wilkinson has been a part of that effort for nearly five decades. We can trust that under his leadership The Tablet's news and editorials highlight our past and tell the story of our future.

At your place setting, you will find a card that reproduces one of the *Tablet*'s front pages. They serve as a testament to the paper's unyielding pledge to report the news. Some of these covers include the last century's most turbulent times-world wars, the assassination of the only Catholic president and calls to stop the arms race. Others celebrate Church events and the consecration of new bishops. Some covers report life at its sweetest—local softball games that ended in victory for the good guys, or photographs of loved ones welcoming soldiers home from Vietnam. Bright Christmas campaigns light up covers, but dim in comparison to the faces of children who receive a special gift they may not have imagined. The pages also showcase the publicity and support of financial campaigns, further enriching the life of the Church.

Ed's approach has always been promoting *The Tablet* as a "sign of unity" by presenting the Church's message to a wider community. He has often said his biggest challenge as editor is, "Giving the readers the news without putting your views in it." Therefore, when he was named editor 33 years ago, he made it his mission to highlight the news in ways the local church was living out its identity as the People of God.

It was under Ed's editorship that the Brooklyn and Queens' unique identity as the diocese of immigrants became the centerfold. The Tablet reports on the diocese's diversity weekly. It covers Mexican faithful carrying torches through the streets and gatherings of Croatian and Vietnamese Catholics. New faith communities are chronicled in their beginning stages, such as the growing African congregation in East New York and Queens Village, alongside the rapidly expanding Asian Catholic population. Visiting prelates from homelands far away connect with newcomers to Brooklyn in the pages of the paper. With each edition, The Tablet helps us see our strength through our diversity.

In an ever-secularizing culture *The Tablet* has earned its reputation as a faithful witness to the truth, both for the Church and the world. The newspaper has not ignored reporting on tough issues. In the face of the culture of death, *The Tablet* affirms the primacy of all life. When clergy were accused of sexual misconduct, *The Tablet* went to print with the news. Through the years, it has covered school closings and parish mergers with perspective often omitted from the secular media.



THE MOST REVEREND NICHOLAS DIMARZIO PH.D., D.D. BISHOP OF BROOKLYN @BpDiMarzio BORN IN NEWARK, NEW JERSEY, on June 16, 1944, His Excellency, the Most Reverend Nicholas DiMarzio, attended the Immaculate Conception Seminary in Darlington, New Jersey, was ordained a Roman Catholic Priest in 1970, and named Prelate of Honor by Pope John Paul II in 1986.

From 1985 to 1991, he served as executive director of the Office of Migration and Refugee Services at the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). Bishop DiMarzio was ordained Auxiliary Bishop of Newark in 1996, where he served as Vicar for Human Services and executive director for their Catholic Charities agency. In 1980, Bishop DiMarzio earned a Masters in Social Work from Fordham University, and a Ph.D. in Social Work Research and Policy in 1985 from Rutgers University.

In July of 1999, Bishop DiMarzio was appointed as the Sixth Bishop of Camden, New Jersey, and served there until October 2003, when he was installed as the Seventh Bishop of Brooklyn.

Bishop DiMarzio has spent his ministry of over 40 years in the areas of immigration assistance and refugee resettlement services. He has served as both an advocate for refugees and immigrant concerns in political forums, and as the initiator and administrator of programs to assist refugees and immigrants within the U.S. and throughout the world.

Bishop DiMarzio is currently Chairman of the Board of the Center for Migration Studies, and the Migration Policy Institute board. He is a member of the boards of CLINIC and the USCCB Migration Committees. Bishop DiMarzio is a former member of the Vatican's Pontifical Council for the Pastoral Care of Migrants and Itinerant People. He also previously chaired the boards of the Migration Committee of the USCCB, the Catholic Legal Immigration Network, Inc. and Finance Committee of Catholic Relief Services. From 2003 to 2005, Bishop DiMarzio served as the U.S. representative to the Global Commission on International Migration, inspired by the United Nations, as our Nation's Commissioner representative.

Bishop DiMarzio served as a consultant for the John Jay Report, a 2004 independent study by the John Jay College of Criminal Justice. Using surveys completed by Roman Catholic dioceses, researchers analyzed "the nature and scope of the problem of sexual abuse of minors by Catholic priests and deacons in the United States." The USCCB commissioned the study. THE REVEREND MONSIGNOR KIERAN E. HARRINGTON, V.E., is Vicar for Communications for the Diocese of Brooklyn. He is also the founder of DeSales Media Group, a full-service media company. In his role as the company's president and chairman, Msgr. Harrington oversees NET TV, a cable television network that can be seen throughout the greater New York area; *The Tablet*, the Diocese of Brooklyn's weekly newspaper with a circulation of 75,000 and 28,000 website page views per month; and *Nuestra Voz*, a monthly Spanish language newspaper with a circulation of 17,000. He also oversees the company's technology division which manages more than 125 websites, and the company's public relations and external affairs departments.

Msgr. Harrington hosts *In The Arena*, a weekly television and radio talk show that airs on NET TV and WOR Radio. He interviews guests, and moderates intense debates covering various political and social issues from a Catholic cultural perspective.

In 2008, Msgr. Harrington became the Rector of Saint Joseph's Co-Cathedral in the Prospect Heights neighborhood where he oversaw a complete restoration of the church and shepherded its elevation to co-cathedral.

Msgr. Harrington graduated cum laude from St. John's University with a degree in philosophy. He holds a Masters of Divinity degree from the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception and a Masters of Business Administration from the N.Y.U. Stern School of Business.

The Most Reverend Thomas V. Daily ordained him a priest at Saint James Cathedral Basilica on June 2, 2001. He is a Knight of the Holy Sepulchre, a Knight of Columbus, and a member of numerous civic organizations. His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI elevated him to the rank of Papal Chaplain with the title of Reverend Monsignor on September 3, 2009.



ATHER THOMAS F. DAILEY joined the St. Charles Borromeo Seminary's Pennsylvania faculty full-time in 2017 as the inaugural John Cardinal Foley Chair of Homiletics & Social Communications. The Cardinal Foley Chair supports the work of the Church in the realm of Gospel communications by educating seminarians and other students, informing staff in parishes and (arch)dioceses, and dialoguing with journalists and media professionals.

Prior to his appointment at the seminary, Father Dailey served on the faculty of DeSales University for 29 years. There he was a tenured professor of Theology, the inaugural Father Louis Brisson Chair in Salesian Spirituality, and the founding director of the Salesian Center for Faith & Culture. He also taught at Immaculata University, the Washington Theological Union, and in the National Institute for Clergy Formation.

Father Dailey earned a doctoral degree in sacred theology (S.T.D.) from the Pontifical Gregorian University (Rome), where he completed his dissertation on the biblical Book of Job. He has lectured internationally on topics in biblical theology, Salesian spirituality, and Catholic higher education. He has written, edited or translated nine books and more than 50 articles/chapters in a variety of scholarly and pastoral publications worldwide. He now writes a monthly column on CatholicPhilly.com and a regular blog post for Seminarian Casual. He also assists with publications as the Research Fellow for the Catholic Leadership Institute in Wayne, PA.

Father Dailey currently serves on the board of trustees of Holy Ghost Preparatory School, his high school alma mater. He is a member of the editorial board of the Indian Journal of Spirituality (Bangalore) and serves as a peer reviewer for the Journal of Catholic Higher *Education*. In 2013, Father Dailey was elected to the Academy of Catholic Theology. Among other awards, he has been nominated twice for inclusion in Who's Who Among Executives and Professionals, and has been selected four times for inclusion in the list of Who's Who Among America's Teachers.

Father Dailey first professed vows in the religious congregation of the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales (O.S.F.S.) in 1980, was ordained to the diaconate in St. Peter's Basilica in 1986, and was ordained to the priesthood in St. Anthony of Padua Church in 1987.

D WILKINSON HAS BEEN THE EDITOR of *The Tablet*, Brooklyn's diocesan newspaper, since 1985. He recently completed his 48th year as a member of *The Tablet's* staff. He joined the newspaper in 1970 as a reporter. Prior to becoming editor, he wrote a weekly sports column.


Ed has won several awards in the Catholic Press Association's annual newspaper contest, including Best News Story, Best Headline Writing, Best Photograph, Best Editorial Writing, and Best Youth Coverage. His column, The Editor's Space, appears weekly in The Tablet. He can also be seen on *Currents News*, the daily Catholic news program on NET, where he conducts a Friday interview with The Most Reverend Nicholas DiMarzio, Bishop of Brooklyn, He also hosts *On the Block*, an interview show that features priests from the metropolitan area in their home neighborhoods. Ed says the most memorable event of his tenure as editor was a personal meeting with Pope John Paul II when he visited New York in 1995.

Ed has been honored by the Msgr. Ferris Life Center, the Helpers of God's Precious Infants, the Catholic-Jewish Relations Committee of Northeast Queens, the Boy Scouts of America, Arriba Juntos Youth Center, the Catholic Teachers Association, the Kings County Ancient Order of Hibernians, and the Cathedral Prep Alumni Association. In 2000, he served as Chief Brehon of Catholic Charities' Great Irish Fair. In 2007, he was selected to be Grand Marshal of the Bay Ridge St. Patrick's Day Parade.

In 2014, Ed received the Bridge to Life Award from the pro-life group of the same name, and he was honored at Brooklyn Borough Hall as the Irishman of the Year at a St. Patrick's Day breakfast.

Born in Greenpoint, Ed is a lifelong resident of Brooklyn. He attended St. Alphonsus Elementary School; Cathedral Prep, Brooklyn; Cathedral College, Douglaston; and studied theology at Immaculate Conception Seminary,

Ed and his wife, Sheila, and their son, Edward Daniel, live in Bay Ridge and are parishioners of Our Lady of Angels parish.

FROM THE DIOCESE OF BROOKLYN AND QUEENS

THE TABLET HAS BEEN THE OFFICIAL CATHOLIC NEWSPAPER of the Diocese of Brooklyn since 1909. Begun in 1908 as a private enterprise, it was purchased by Brooklyn's second bishop, Charles E. McDonnell, as the voice of the Church in Brooklyn.

For 110 years, it has been published on a weekly basis. The Tablet brings its readers news, commentary and reactions to the life of the Catholic Church. Once a national publication, today The Tablet concentrates on local news written by staff members, with national and international news supplied by Catholic News Service in Washington, D.C.

Originally, a standard size sheet, *The Tablet* is now a full-color tabloid publication that is printed on the state-of-the-art presses of the Staten Island Advance in Staten Island.

In addition to news, each week's edition includes a column by Bishop Nicholas DiMarzio, The Editor's Space by Editor Ed Wilkinson, commentary on the week's Scriptures, letters to the editor, an arts and leisure column by Father Robert Lauder, and Around the Diocese, a calendar of upcoming events in the parishes of Brooklyn and Queens.

With a circulation of almost 75,000, The Tablet is the only diocesan-run Catholic weekly in New York City. It also has circulation in 45 states across the country.

HE ROMAN CATHOLIC DIOCESE OF BROOKLYN serves the boroughs of Brooklyn and Queens. It is presided by the seventh and current Bishop of Brooklyn, His Excellency, the Most Reverend Nicholas DiMarzio, a champion of immigrant rights.

The boroughs' combined population stands at more than 4.9 million, of which 1.5 million identify themselves as Catholics. The diocesan cathedral is the Cathedral Basilica of St. James in downtown Brooklyn. The Co-Cathedral of St. Joseph in Prospect Heights was elevated in February 2013 by Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, and was dedicated on May 13, 2014, by Bishop DiMarzio. The faces of the people in the pews of St. Joseph's reflect the diversity of the many cultures that call the Diocese of Brooklyn home. It is also among the largest churches in Brooklyn and Queens.

Due to its multicultural and diverse populations, Masses are regularly held in 24 different languages across the Diocese, throughout 185 parishes with 210 churches. Its 26 ethnic ministries promote cultural events and provide an opportunity for immigrants to belong to the larger community while preserving and sharing their uniqueness and traditions.

Within its borders is the seventh largest Catholic school network in the United States, with 85 elementary schools and academies that educate more than 27,000 students.

Last year, the diocese celebrated 15,885 Baptisms. There were 11,957 First Communions, 9,549 Confirmations and 1,951 Marriages. The diocese had an average weekly attendance of nearly 230,000 of the faithful at over 1,000 weekly Sunday Masses said in Brooklyn and Queens.
